General terms and conditions

- All programmes are subject to availability at the time of booking.
- The price of the trip may be modified up to 20 calendar days before departure as a result of changes in the cost of fuel, taxes, port and airport taxes or tourist surcharges, as well as applicable exchange rates and in the event of not reaching the minimum number of registered participants necessary to guarantee the trip. If the price increase communicated exceeds 8% of the price of the trip, the client may, within a period not exceeding 48 hours of notification, accept the proposed change or terminate the contract without penalty.
- Likewise, the traveller is entitled to a reduction of the price in relation to the eventual decrease of costs, taxes, surcharges or applicable exchange rates, which occur until the beginning of the trip, in which case TUR4all Travel may deduct from the refund the actual administrative costs of its processing.
- The allocation of adapted rooms is guaranteed based on the availability of the accommodation.
- Single and triple rooms are subject to availability and price at the time of booking.
- People who require assistance in carrying out basic activities of daily living must be accompanied by a companion.







Terms of payment


At the time of booking confirmation, the traveller must pay 50% of the total price. The remaining amount (50%) must be paid 30 days before departure at the latest. In case the traveller does not comply with these deadlines, TUR4all Travel reserves the right to cancel the services and apply the penalty foreseen in the section "Cancellation conditions, II. Cancellation by the traveller" before the departure of the trip.



I. Cancellation by the organiser before departure.

TUR4all Travel may cancel the trip without additional compensation to the traveller if any of the following conditions are met, in which case the full amount of the trip will be refunded within a maximum of 14 calendar days after notifying the traveller.

- 1. In the event that the minimum number of registered participants required to guarantee the departure is not reached, in which case the traveller shall be notified within the following period:
 - Trips with a duration of more than 6 days: 20 calendar days before the start of the trip.
 - Journeys lasting between 2 and 6 days: 7 calendar days before the start of the journey.
 - Journeys lasting less than 2 days: 2 calendar days before the start of the journey.





2. In case of an unavoidable and extraordinary event, in which case TUR4all Travel will notify the traveller as soon as possible.

II. Cancellation by the passenger before departure.

The traveller may cancel the trip at any time before the start date, in which case TUR4all Travel will apply the penalty according to each case, depending on the services contracted and the date on which the cancellation occurs. The refund will be made minus the penalty and within a maximum period of 14 calendar days after receiving the notification of the cancellation of the contracted services.




